

CITY OF ENGLEWOOD

BOARD OF HEALTH REGULAR MEETING

April 10, 2013

1. The regular meeting of the Board of Health, City of Englewood, Bergen County, was called to order at 8:03 p.m. by Dr. Lisa L. Wisotsky, President, Board of Health.

MEMBERS PRESENT:

Dr. Lisa L. Wisotsky, President; JoEllen Bostick, Vice President (joined meeting telephonically at 9:16 p.m.); Bertha-Nora Acosta; Stephanie Davis; Lisa Levien; Dr. Earl A. Marsan; and Ketsia Alerte Sadler (arrived 8:40 p.m.).

ALSO PRESENT:

Nelson Xavier Cruz, Director, Health Services/Health Officer/Secretary to the Board; Richard A. Lustgarten, Esq., Board of Health Attorney; and Janet Kast, Confidential Executive Secretary.

Mr. Cruz read the Open Public Meetings Statement. All stood to recite the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. A. Motion to approve Items 2. A. i. (Minutes of March 14, 2013 Meeting); 2. A. ii. (Receipts – March, 2013); 2. A. iii. (Bills – March, 2013); 2. A. iv. (Employee Reports – March, 2013); 2. A. v. (Digest of Mail – March, 2013); and 2. A. vi. (Communications, March, 2013).

Motion to approve Items 2.A. i - vi. was made by Ms. Davis, and seconded by Dr. Marsan.

Dr. Wisotsky requested that the minutes of the March 14, 2013 Board of Health meeting be amended as follows: On page 2 of the minutes, under Old Business, Item No. 4, 2013 Budget, “Mr. Cruz stated that on March 13, 2013, he and the Board of Health presented the proposed 2013 Health Department budget to the City Council for their consideration and adoption. After a discussion on the budget, a reduction of \$30,000 in the Health Officer’s salary was proposed.” be amended to read “Mr. Cruz stated that on March 13, 2013, he and the Board of Health presented the proposed 2013 Health Department budget to the City Council for their consideration and adoption. As per Mr. Cruz, after a discussion on the budget, a reduction of \$30,000 in the Health Officer’s salary was proposed.”

Motion to discuss the proposed amendment was made by Dr. Wisotsky, and seconded by Ms. Davis.

After a brief discussion, Dr. Wisotsky made a motion to amend Item 4, 2013 Budget, of the March 14, 2013 Board of Health Meeting minutes, to read as follows: “Mr. Cruz stated that on March 13, 2013, he and the Board of Health presented the proposed 2013 Health Department budget to the City Council for their consideration and adoption, and after a discussion on the budget, a reduction of \$30,000 in the Health Officer’s salary was proposed.”, and to delete her prior motion. Ms. Davis, the seconder, accepted Dr. Wisotsky’s new motion.

A roll call vote ensued:

Motion was approved 4-0, with one abstention.

Motion to approve Items. 2.A. i. – vi., with the March 14, 2013 minutes as amended, was approved 5-0.

Mr. Cruz reported that cash receipts for the month of March, 2013 were \$13,612.50. Vouchers/Orders for Payment for March, 2013 were \$7,764.24. Non-budget payments were \$1,594.80. Electronic Death Registration Receipts for the month of March, 2013 totaled \$733.00.

2. B. Motion to approve retail licenses – March, 2013

Since Mr. Cruz reported that there were approximately 239 retail licenses to be approved for the month of March, 2013, Mr. Lustgarten suggested that, instead of reading them aloud, they be marked as “Schedule A” and referred to as that, and added to the minutes for April 10, 2013. Motion to approve the retail licenses as set forth in Schedule A was made by Dr. Earl Marsan, and seconded by Ms. Acosta. Mr. Cruz stated that there had not been any written or verbal objection to date to the approval of these licenses. Motion was approved 5-0.

- 2. C. i. Board Liaison Reports
- ii. Committee Reports

Ms. Davis, Board of Education Liaison, requested that Mr. Cruz begin contacting the schools regarding setting up cooling centers as the warmer months draw closer.

Mr. Lustgarten stated that Mr. Cruz had been served with a Rice Notice relating to a discussion in Closed Session of a personnel matter, and that the 2013 budget discussion was tied into that to an extent. He said that Mr. Cruz had exercised his right under the Statute to have the Personnel matter discussed in the public session. He said it is his right, and it is not appealable by the Board.

OLD BUSINESS

3. 2013 Budget

Mr. Cruz reported that on March 13, 2013, he presented the proposed 2013 budget of the Englewood Health Department to the City Council for their consideration and adoption. He said the proposed budget is for a total amount of \$721,883.00. Salary and Wages (SW) is in the amount of \$642,483.00, and Other Expenses (OE) is in the amount of \$79,400.00. The proposed capital budget request is in the amount of \$5,193.00. Mr. Cruz stated that the City Council plans to adopt and submit the 2013 City Budget to the State by no later than April 27, 2013 for their approval.

4. Supreme Oil Case

Mr. Lustgarten reported that the trial date regarding the outstanding summonses for the Supreme Oil case is set for Wednesday, April 17, 2013. He said that Supreme Oil, through its attorneys, has prepared a professional engineering report, and that he received a copy of that report. Mr. Lustgarten forwarded this report to the City Engineer and said Mr. Cruz would send a copy to Mr. Dacey, City Manager. Mr. Lustgarten said that it appears

that some remedial work needs to be done on that site and a long-range agreement needs to be reached between Supreme Oil and the City.

5. 2013 Financial Disclosure Statements

Mr. Cruz stated that, as conveyed to the Board at the March 14, 2013 Board Meeting, the Financial Disclosure Statements must now be completed and submitted online, and no hard copies will be permitted. He said there has been a delay in the delivery of the Financial Disclosure Statements by the City Clerk, and that an extension to the deadline will be applied to the completion and submission of the statements to the State. He said that he and the Confidential Executive Secretary would be available to assist any Board Member experiencing problems with completing the form electronically.

6. Department Telephone Log

As per Ms. Levien's request, Mr. Cruz stated that the Department staff had maintained a log of all phone calls to and from the Department from mid-February through March, 2013. He reported that during the month of March, 2013, the Department generated a total of 1,431 telephone calls, or 1,098 incoming and 333 outgoing calls. He said the Department generates an average of approximately 1,200 incoming/outgoing calls per month, or 14,400 incoming/outgoing calls per year. The average number of incoming/outgoing calls per year being generated per staff member is 1,108. Mr. Cruz stated that the majority of the calls, both incoming and outgoing, were in the Vital Statistics and Administration Units.

After a brief discussion of the usefulness and practicality of keeping the logs, Mr. Lustgarten asked for a consensus of the Board to rescind the maintenance of the phone logs. All members voted "Aye."

Dr. Wisotsky stated that she wanted to discuss an e-mail sent by Mr. Cruz on January 8, 2013 to Councilmen Skurnick and Hamer, with a copy to the Board, regarding the outsourcing of the Public Health Nurse at the Englewood Health Department. She said there appears to have been a misunderstanding of the facts involved, and that there was no discussion on the Council level of this.

Dr. Wisotsky was also concerned about the fact that, in the e-mail, Mr. Cruz stated that the Board of Health did not support the proposed shared services agreement for public health nursing with the Bergen County Department of Health Services and firmly believed that such an agreement would not be in the best interest of the Englewood tax payer. She stated that the Board had not been consulted on this matter, and that Mr. Cruz should not have referred to the Board. Instead, she said, he could have said "the Director/Health Officer did not support...and firmly believed..." etc. Ms. Levien stated that Mr. Cruz should only speak for the Board after the Board has met and discussed a matter; otherwise, he should make it clear it is his own feeling or opinion.

Mr. Cruz stated that he would take responsibility for that, and in the future, would speak as the Health Officer, and discuss matters with the Board prior to issuing such a statement on an issue. Dr. Wisotsky said her point was that the Health Officer is to advise the Board, formulate policy, and make recommendations to the Board, but the Board has to have a discussion on the issues.

NEW BUSINESS

7. National Public Health Week

Mr. Cruz reported to the Board on the Department's activities during National Public Health Week. On April 2, Health Department staff provided blood pressure screening and information on health issues at the Englewood

ShopRite. On April 3, the Department held Employee Wellness Day at City Hall and provided blood pressure screening and information on stress management and "Life Expectancy."

On April 4, Mr. Cruz attended a reception, along with Board Vice President JoEllen Bostick and Board Member Ketsia Alerte Sadler, sponsored by the Bergen County Department of Health Services and the Bergen County Health Officers Society, honoring Boards of Health members for their service and dedication to the field of public health. One of the honorees was Dr. Earl A. Marsan, Englewood Board of Health Member. Mr. Cruz gave Dr. Marsan two certificates honoring his service to the Englewood community, one signed by Senator Loretta Weinberg, Assemblyman Gordon Johnson, and Assemblywoman Valerie Huttler, and the other from Bergen County, signed by Kathleen Donovan, County Executive.

On April 5, Department staff provided information on childhood immunization, lead poisoning, and infant death at the Bergen Family Center.

8. Englewood Family Health Festival

Mr. Cruz proposed the Englewood Family Health Festival 2013 be held on Saturday, September 7, 2013, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at Depot Park, with a rain date of Saturday, September 20, 2013. A discussion ensued regarding the best day/date to hold the festival, in order to minimize overtime costs and make the festival available for all four wards. Dr. Wisotsky proposed Friday, October 4, 2013, and said she would speak to City Manager Tim Dacey about it. She said if the City Manager is agreeable to both dates proposed, there could be a vote at the next Board meeting on May 8, 2013.

Motion to hold the Englewood Family Health Festival on Friday, October 4, 2013, and have the rain date at the discretion of the Health Officer, was made by Dr. Marsan, and seconded by Dr. Wisotsky. All members voted "Aye," in favor. Motion was carried.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Motion to open the time for public comment was made by Ms. Davis, and seconded by Ms. Levien. Motion was approved 6-0.

There were no questions or comments from the public. Motion to close the time for public comment was made by Ms. Levien, and seconded by Ms. Acosta. Motion was approved 6-0.

For the record, Ms. JoEllen Bostick was reached by telephone at approximately 9:16 p.m. and attended the remainder of the meeting through telephonic communication.

Mr. Lustgarten advised the public who were present that a personnel matter was listed on the agenda in Closed Session, and that a Rice notice had been issued. Since the recipient of the Rice notice, Mr. Cruz, has the right, under the Open Public Meetings Act, to request that the discussion be held in Open Session, and had so requested, the Personnel Matter was now to be discussed in Open Session.

9. Personnel Matter

Dr. Wisotsky stated that at the last Board meeting on March 14, 2013, Ms. Levien had asked Mr. Cruz a number of questions. Mr. Cruz had answered those questions but, because they were not in Closed Session, the Board did not have a discussion. She said Ms. Levien was going to ask the questions again, and referred the Board to page 4 of the March 14, 2013 Board Meeting Minutes.

Ms. Levien stated that the questions asked at the March 14, 2013 Board Meeting referred to the budget hearing, some of which contravened some of the instructions that Mr. Cruz had been given. She said Mr. Cruz had gone through his budget presentation for the Board twice before the presentation to the City Council. The Board had requested that certain items be deleted from his presentation and that he not emphasize certain matters. Ms. Levien stated that if one were to define their ability and their charge in the narrowest sense, the Board is to make policy, and the Director/Health Officer is to implement that policy. She said there seems to be a disconnect in the implementation of that policy, and that Mr. Cruz does not make clear what the Board's position is and what his position is.

Ms. Levien asked Mr. Cruz to comment specifically on his answer to her question #5 at the March 14, 2013 meeting, which she found very disturbing. The question was "What is the meaning of your closing statement that the City has been targeting your position for the last seven years because you are Hispanic?"

Mr. Cruz replied that he is the only Hispanic Department Head in the City of Englewood and the only individual being singled out for a salary reduction.

Ms. Levien said that Mr. Cruz did not say that was his opinion, either personally or in his capacity as Director and Health Officer. Mr. Cruz said he would take responsibility for not saying that, even though it was his opinion. He felt it was his only opportunity to say that because, in past meetings with the Board, it did not appear to be an issue for the Board.

Ms. Levien repeated question #1 from the March 14, 2013 meeting: "Why did you include the per capita cost of the Health Department vs. the per capita cost of the Police and Fire Departments when you were specifically instructed by the Board in December, and again in January, to omit this from your presentation?"

Dr. Wisotsky read Mr. Cruz's previous answer, that the per capita cost is very important, and that the Health Department is considered an emergency responder with the Fire and Police Departments. He said that people are looking at cost, and he thinks that the Health Department does a very effective job of containing those costs that should not be overlooked.

Mr. Cruz said that was correct, and that when you compare the Health Department's per capita cost with the other two Departments, the Health Department's is the lowest.

Dr. Wisotsky asked Mr. Cruz if he had been instructed twice by the Board, in December and in January, to remove the per capita comparison between the Health Department and the Police and Fire Departments. Mr. Cruz answered that he was. Dr. Wisotsky stated that several Council members were upset about the per capita comparison and felt it had no place in the budget hearing. Dr. Wisotsky said that at that point in the presentation, she had interrupted the discussion and told the Council that Mr. Cruz had been instructed not to mention a per capita comparison, and asked if they could just move on with the hearing. She said she should not have been put in that position when Mr. Cruz had been instructed not to include this. She emphasized how important it is for Mr. Cruz to be able to work not only with the Board, but also with the City Council.

Dr. Wisotsky felt that the per capita comparison did not enhance the budget presentation; it distracted from it. Mr. Cruz answered that in order to implement innovative ideas, you must look at the cost involved. Dr. Wisotsky repeated that the objection was to the comparison with the Police and Fire Departments. She said the Board and Council members felt that it was irrelevant and that Mr. Cruz was instructed to keep it out of his presentation. Mr. Cruz stated he felt it was relevant and he stood by it. Dr. Wisotsky responded that Mr. Cruz should have said, then, that "although he had been instructed by the Board to exclude it, he felt it was important because...."

Ms. Bostick felt if Mr. Cruz was going to do a comparison, he should be comparing the activities of the Department staff with the previous year's activities.

Ms. Levien said that it had been a policy decision made by the Board, and Mr. Cruz's job was to implement policy. Mr. Cruz said he would not mention per capita costs again unless so instructed by the Board.

Ms. Levien read question #3 from last month's meeting: "When the Board asked you specifically to keep your presentation to under ten minutes, why was your presentation significantly longer than that?"

Mr. Cruz answered that he wanted to stress some of the accomplishments and achievements of the Health Department point by point because he feels that public health is taken for granted.

Dr. Wisotsky stated that the Department budget matched the City Manager's budget, and instead of a forty minute presentation, Mr. Cruz should have simply asked the Council if they had any questions for him.

Dr. Wisotsky said the Board must have confidence in its Health Officer and Chief Executive to carry out the policies of the Board consistent with the law. She said not following the protocol given to Mr. Cruz, after two dry runs of the budget presentation to the Board, raises the question as to whether there was a deliberate disregard of instructions or whether he simply was unable to present as he was instructed to do.

Dr. Wisotsky asked Ms. Levien to re-read question #5 again: "What is the meaning of your closing statement that the City has been targeting your position for the last several years because you are Hispanic?"

Mr. Cruz answered that he was troubled to be the only Hispanic that was singled out. He said for the last two years, the City Manager, Mr. Dacey, has been targeting the position of Health Officer. Mr. Cruz stated that Mr. Dacey proposed entering into a shared services agreement with Leonia, which did not work out. Then Mr. Dacey presented the opportunity to enter into a shared services arrangement with Teaneck, where Mr. Cruz would serve as the Health Officer for Englewood and Teaneck, which did not work out, he believed because the Teaneck Health Officer returned to his job. Mr. Cruz said that next, a plan had been developed for the Health Officer of Teaneck to oversee both Englewood and Teaneck, which he understands is no longer on the table.

Dr. Wisotsky asked Mr. Cruz if he was stating that there had been no discrimination against him because of his ethnicity. Mr. Cruz answered that because he just happened to be Hispanic and that it was the only incident, he felt amicus bias was being displayed by the Mayor and City Council, and he believed his civil rights were being violated. He said the New Jersey law against discrimination is very specific when it has to do with recruitment, retention, and compensation, which he said applies to him. He said he happens to be a member of a protected class.

Mr. Lustgarten, Board of Health Attorney, interrupted at this point and asked for clarification of Mr. Cruz's statement at the budget presentation that the City has been targeting his position for the last several years because he is Hispanic. He asked Mr. Cruz if he was including the Board or any member of the Board in that statement or if he was targeting the City. Mr. Cruz answered that he was not including the Board collectively or any member of the Board.

Ms. Levien repeated question #2 from the March 14, 2013 meeting: "Why did you include shared services in your presentation when, according to the previous meeting, it was no longer an issue on the table and had no place in the budget presentation, and you had received no directive from the Board to make that a part of your presentation?"

Mr. Cruz answered that he needed to present that because what was proposed at that particular time was the prospect of entering into a shared services agreement, where his time would be reduced. When it was suddenly no longer on the table, the response was for the City to reduce his salary.

Ms. Levien said that by March 13, 2013, the City had advised the Board that they would take the idea of shared services completely off the table if Mr. Cruz would accede to a rather hefty and unfortunate budget cut to his salary. She said Mr. Cruz had been involved in that negotiation, had consulted with several people, and had acceded to it. He also presented back to the Council a budget with that particular cut. Mr. Cruz asked to clarify that. He said he presented a new budget at the direction of the Board and said that when he responded to that offer, he was under duress. He felt if he didn't agree, he would lose his job.

Ms. Levien stated that she felt it was incumbent on Mr. Cruz to say that he could not accept a cut in salary of that magnitude at that time, but not to make the arguments with the Board at their budget meeting. She said they thought they had a deal with Mr. Cruz, but for him to come back and re-try the deal later was not proper. Mr. Cruz felt he was pressured into it by the Board, and he was not given much of an option.

Ms. Bostick commented that the salary reduction had been discussed with Mr. Cruz before the meeting, and he had had an opportunity to say he was not pleased with it, and an opportunity to ask to keep it in the budget, but neither of those two directions were taken by him. By not saying anything, he denied the Board the opportunity to look for another option. Mr. Cruz answered that he didn't think he had another option. He said he felt it was a "done deal," and what the City Manager wanted.

Dr. Wisotsky stated that her main concern was that an agreement had been reached, which Mr. Cruz referred to as "a deal," and then he attacked the process as if he had no idea of what was happening. She said Mr. Cruz had accepted the salary reduction in a meeting with Ms. Bostick and herself on February 6, 2013, and again on February 13, 2013, and so stated to the Board. She said the time for him to have rejected the proposal would have been with the Board, instead of contradicting his position with the Board in front of the Council. She said in fact, Mr. Cruz and Ms. Baldwin, Office Manager/Administrative Assistant/Registrar of the Department, revised the figures to be presented to the Council, so he was well aware of the reduction in salary prior to the budget hearing.

Dr. Wisotsky said for Mr. Cruz to raise the issue at the budget presentation, and make the presentation all about this issue, was a total surprise to Board members, a breach of protocol and good faith, based on his prior acceptance. She said that effectively, Mr. Cruz said one thing to the Board and another thing to the Council, which she felt was a breach of good faith, and gave the appearance that he and the Board were working at cross-purposes.

Mr. Cruz answered that he is not supporting the deal. Dr. Wisotsky asked him to clarify his statement. She asked if what he was saying was, if he were offered the salary of \$99,950, after his current contract expires, he would not accept that salary. Mr. Cruz said that was correct.

Mr. Lustgarten stated that at that time, the Board could have a discussion, based on what was just discussed or any other topic, or the Board could consider this meeting over. He said that procedurally, the Health Officer's contract expires near the end of July. If by either side, either the Board or Mr. Cruz, there is not intent to continue that contract, the Board needs to consider, probably at its May meeting, a process for a search. He said the Board and the Department need a Health Officer. He said the Board does not want to be in a situation where, if the Board and Mr. Cruz do not reach common ground because of some actions by the City, the Department is left without a Health Officer commencing in August.

Dr. Wisotsky stated that the proposed salary of \$99,950 is competitive, based on her research of area Health Officers' salaries, and that Mr. Cruz just stated that that salary is unacceptable to him, so the Board should form a search committee. She also stated that the issue of the Health Officer's salary was never about the person, but about the position. Mr. Cruz said he disagreed with her and believes it is about the person, and the issue is with the Mayor and the City Manager. He had stated it has nothing to do with the Board of Health.

Dr. Richard Pierson asked to make a comment. Motion to return to Public Comment, with a two minute limit per speaker, due to the hour, was made by Ms. Levien, and seconded by Ms. Acosta. Motion was approved 6-0.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Dr. Richard Pierson, 60 Lincoln Street

Dr. Pierson spoke about the changes in the Department over the years and lamented the fact that it seems to be returning to a smaller department, offering fewer services, as was the case thirty-five years ago.

Motion to close the time for public comment was made by Dr. Wisotsky, and seconded by Ms. Levien. Motion was approved 6-0.

There being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Dr. Wisotsky, and seconded by Ms. Davis. All members voted "Aye," in favor. Motion was carried.

The meeting ended at 10:00 p.m.
