ORDINANCE #10-07

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO.07-02 ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ENGLEWOOD, BERGEN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY, PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND OTHER RELATED EXPENSES TO MACKAY PARK IN AND FOR THE CITY OF ENGLEWOOD AND APPROPRIATING \$330,000 THEREFORE, AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$314,285 IN BONDS OR NOTES OF THE CITY OF ENGLEWOOD TO FINANCE SAME

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 07-02 was adopted and approved on February 13, 2007 and the improvements authorized thereunder have been completed; and

WHEREAS, there remains available funds in the amount of \$40,000 under the original authorization; and

WHEREAS, a need exists to make improvements to a parcel of public land identified as Block 3402, Lot 1, which lies between Walton Street and Route 4.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Englewood, Bergen County, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-39, Section 3 of Ordinance No. 07-02, is hereby amended to include as an authorized purpose the improvement to Block 3402, Lot 1 with the installation of a landscaped berm for a distance of approximately five hundred (500) feet.

Section 2. All other provisions of Ordinance No. 07-02 shall remain unchanged.

Section 3. The capital budget of the City is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 4. To the extent that any previous ordinance or resolution is inconsistent herewith or contradictory hereto, said ordinance or resolution is hereby repealed or amended to the extent necessary to make it consistent herewith.

Section 5. If any sentence, section, clause or other portion of this ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, shall for any reason be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or repeal the remainder of this ordinance.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

ORDINANCE #10-08

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 18 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF ENGLEWOOD PERTAINING TO HEALTH INSURANCE CONTRIBUTIONS AND THE HEALTH INSURANCE WAIVER PROGRAM

WHEREAS, Chapter 2, Public Laws of 2010 takes effect on May 21, 2010, and will require that all municipal employees contribute 1.5% of base salary towards the cost of health insurance as of the effective date of the law or upon the expiration of any existing collective bargaining agreement whichever occurs first; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 2, public Laws of 2010 also reduces the amount that a municipality may pay to an employee who waives health insurance coverage; and

WHEREAS, the City Council previously adopted Ordinance No. 07-23 and Ordinance No. 09-21 which provide for a health insurance waiver program for City of Englewood employees and requires health insurance contributions for unclassified employees, respectively; and.

WHEREAS, there is a need to amend these ordinances to be consistent with the provisions of Chapter 2, Public Laws of 2010;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Englewood, Bergen County, New Jersey, that Chapter 18 of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Englewood is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1. Article 19, Section 18-98 C(i) of Chapter 18 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Effective January 1, 2010, employees participating in the Health Insurance Waiver Program shall be paid twenty-five percent (25%) of the amount saved by the City or \$5,000, whichever is less. The amount saved by the City is defined as the premium due minus the contribution the employee would have made if the employee did not waive coverage. The premium due is defined as the average cost for all plans offered for the individual's level of coverage if they were enrolled in the City's plan.

Section 2. Article 19, Section 18-99 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Effective May 22, 2010, or upon the expiration of any existing collective bargaining agreement, whichever shall occur first, employees of the City shall be required to contribute annually one and one-half percent (1 ½%) of his or her base wages, as defined by the State, for the cost of health insurance through equal payroll withholdings.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 4. If any sentence, section, clause or other portion of this ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, shall for any reason be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or repeal the remainder of this ordinance.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to the law.

ORDINANCE #10-09

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 25, SECTION 25-18 SCHEDULE X
OF THE TRAFFIC AND PARKING ORDINANCE
OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF ENGLEWOOD

WHEREAS, Chapter 25, Section 25-18 Schedule X restricts parking on certain streets within the City of Englewood; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City of Englewood wishes to amend the aforesaid Section to modify limitations on parking at designated areas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Englewood, Bergen County, New Jersey, that Chapter 25-18, Schedule X is hereby amended as follows:

Parking shall be permitted on Huguenot Avenue South 212 feet from the existing eastern most boundary to Starling Road. Huguenot Avenue South subpart b which reads "from the westerly curb line of Starling Road to a point 210 feet westerly thereof" is hereby amended and eliminated.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that Schedule X as it pertains to Huguenot Avenue North is further amended as follows:

No parking shall be permitted 390 feet from the corner of Broad Avenue.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE #10-10

ORDINANCE REAPPROPRIATING \$35,000 PROCEEDS OF OBLIGATIONS
NOT NEEDED FOR THEIR ORIGINAL PURPOSES IN ORDER TO PROVIDE
FOR THE REFURBISHMENT OF FIRE APPARATUS FOR THE CITY OF
ENGLEWOOD AND OTHER RELATED EXPENSES IN AND BY THE CITY OF
ENGLEWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ENGLEWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO-THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-39, it is hereby determined that \$35,000.00 of the proceeds of obligations originally made available pursuant to Section 3(p) of Bond Ordinance No. 06-08 of the City of Englewood, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "City"), finally adopted June 20, 2006 as amended by Ordinance No. 07-13 of the City finally adopted June 16, 2007, as further amended by a reappropriation Ordinance No. 08-04 of the City finally adopted February 5, 2008, as further amended by a reappropriation Ordinance No. 08-14 of the City finally adopted May 20, 2008 and further amended by a reappropriation Ordinance No. 09-07 of the City finally adopted March 19, 2010 (collectively, the "Ordinance"), is no longer necessary for the purposes for which the obligations previously were authorized.

Section 2. The \$35,000.00 described in Section 1 and made available pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-39 is hereby reappropriated to provide for the refurbishment of fire apparatus for the City and including all work and materials necessary therefore or incidental thereto.

Section 3. The capital budget of the City is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

RESOLUTION #115-05-18-10

RESOLUTION CERTIFYING THE GENERAL FUND TAX LEVY FOR THE ENGLEWOOD PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF EDUCATION FOR THE SCHOOL YEARS 2010-2011, BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ENGLEWOOD, COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the School District General Fund Base Budget requiring \$48,118,128 to be raised by property taxes for the School Year 2010-11 (SY2010-11) for the Englewood Public School District was defeated at a public election held on April 20, 2010; and

WHEREAS, the Education, Budgets and Appropriations Law, N.J.S.A. 28a:22-37, requires the Governing Body of the City of Englewood, after consultation with the Englewood Public School District Board of Education, to determine the amount that is necessary to be appropriated in such budget and to certify to the County Board of Taxation the total amount so determined; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Englewood having received the defeated base budget, the City Council, consistent with the recommendation of the Mayor, formed a subcommittee of the Governing Body comprised of Mayor Frank Huttel III, Councilwoman Lynn Algrant and Councilman Ken Rosenzweig to coordinate and consult with the Board of Education; and

WHEREAS, the Englewood Board of Education also formed a subcommittee to coordinate and consult with the Mayor and City Council Subcommittee comprised of George Garrison, the Board of Education President, Henry Pruitt, the Board of Education Vice President, Stephen Brown and Glenn Garrison, Board of Education Members, along with Dr. Richard Segall, the Superintendent of Schools and James Olobardi, the School Business Administrator; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council Subcommittee met several times with the Englewood Board of Education Budget Committee with the goal of the respective committees being to arrive at a General Fund School Tax Levy and SY2010-11 Budget accomplished there under that could be endorsed by the Mayor, City Council and the Board of Education be ultimately enacted by City Council by resolution and accepted by the Board of Education; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council Subcommittee established its goal to reprioritize funding designated in the defeated budget for the construction of the central office for the school district, a new school building and to utilize anticipated surpluses to reinstate budget cuts for classroom instruction and education while providing tax relief to the Englewood taxpayers given the current, extraordinary economic climate; and

WHEREAS, through this enforcement of the principles arrived at by the committees, classroom instruction staff shall be restored, classroom sizes shall remain fixed and there shall be \$1,277,338 restored directly to classroom instruction; and

WHEREAS, through the reallocation of budget line items stated above, the Mayor and City Council further accomplished a SY2010-11 General Fund School Tax Levy to be enacted and accomplished under this resolution that shall be set at \$46,492,456.00 representing a reduction from the original, defeated budget and levy of \$48,118,128.00 and which represents a relief in taxes of \$1,625,672.00; and

WHEREAS, the new SY2010-11 General Fund School Tax Levy shall represent a 1.02% increase from the SY2009-10 School Tax Levy and Budget; and

WHEREAS, the new SY2010-11 General Fund School Tax Levy, which shall hereinafter be set at \$46,492,456.00, shall accomplish the predetermined Adequacy Budget that is specific to the Englewood Public School District and is determined by the New Jersey Department of Education in keeping with accomplishing a Thorough and Efficient Education for our students as instructed by the State Constitution and State Law; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Governing Body has determined that a net reduction of \$1,625,672.00 be made to the revenue and appropriations as detailed on the attached appendix A, for an adjusted total general fund tax levy amount of \$46,492,456.00 for Local School District Taxes for the fiscal year from July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2011; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Governing Body does hereby certify that the revised amount to be raised in taxes in the amount of \$46,492,456.00 is sufficient to provide a thorough and efficient education and that a Certification setting for the amount to be levied for 2010/2011 school year be filed with the County Board of Taxation, the Board of Education of the City of Englewood, and the County Superintendent of Schools of Bergen County.
