ORDINANCE #14-01

BOND ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$7,650,000 FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A FIRE HOUSE AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$7,267,500 OF BONDS AND/OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES FOR SAID IMPROVEMENT, AUTHORIZED TO BE UNDERTAKEN IN AND BY THE CITY OF ENGLEWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ENGLEWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), **AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. The improvement and purpose described in Section 3 of this Bond Ordinance are hereby authorized as a capital improvement to be made or acquired by the City of Englewood, County of Bergen, New Jersey (hereinafter referred to as the "City"). For said improvement or purpose stated in Section 3 hereof, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$7,650,000. A down payment of \$382,500 is herein appropriated from the capital improvement fund or other funds of the City as the downpayment for the purposes or improvements authorized herein, in accordance with the provisions of the Local Bond Law (N.J.S.A.40A:2-1 *et seq.*, hereinafter the "Law").

Section 2. For the financing of said obligations and to meet the part of said \$7,650,000 appropriation not otherwise provided for hereunder, negotiable bonds of the City are hereby authorized to be issued in a principal amount not to exceed \$7,267,500 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes in the principal amount not to exceed \$7,267,500 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Law. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this Ordinance, the aggregate amount of bond anticipation notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed \$7,267,500, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such bond anticipation notes then outstanding, at maturity. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed and shall be under the seal of said City and attested as permitted by law. The appropriate City officers are hereby authorized to execute said bond anticipation notes and to issue said notes in such form as may be adopted in conformity with law. The power to determine all matters in connection with this ordinance and also the power to sell said bond anticipation notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer of the City (the "Financial Officer"), who is hereby authorized to sell said bond anticipation notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law and the Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The Financial Officer is authorized and directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of bond anticipation notes pursuant to this ordinance is made, such report to include the principal amount, description, interest rate and maturity of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 3. The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for which said obligations are to be issued is as follows:

Construction of a new Fire House to include but not limited to building design and construction, site work, furniture and equipment, construction management, contingency for additional expenses and costs, and including all costs, improvements, equipment and/or appurtenances necessary therefore and related thereto.	\$7,650,000	\$382,500	\$7,267,500	30

Section 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense and is property or an improvement which the City may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of said purpose is within the limitations of the Local Bond Law taking into consideration the amount of obligations authorized by this bond ordinance, the period of usefulness is 30 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the City Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such Statement shows that the gross debt of the City determined as provided in said Law is increased by this bond ordinance by \$7,267,500 and obligations authorized and/or hereunder will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Law.
- (d) Amounts not exceeding \$1,530,000 in the aggregate for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 of the Local Bond Law may be included as part of the costs of said improvements and are included in the foregoing estimates thereof.

Section 5. Any grant or other moneys received for the purpose described in Section 3 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvement, obligation or acquisition or to payment of the obligation issued pursuant to this ordinance and the amount of the obligations authorized herein for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 6. The full faith and credit of the City are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the City, and, unless paid from other revenues of the City, the City shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the City for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 7. The capital budget of the City is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, Department of Community Affairs, showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the City Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 8. The City reasonably expects to reimburse any expenditures towards the costs of the improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this ordinance and paid prior to the issuance of any bonds or notes authorized by this ordinance with the proceeds of such bonds or notes. No funds from sources other than the bonds or notes authorized herein has been or is reasonably expected to be reserved, allocated on a long-term basis or otherwise set aside by the City, pursuant to its budget or financial policies with respect to any expenditures to be reimbursed. This Section is intended to be and hereby is a declaration of the City's official intent to reimburse any expenditures towards the costs of the improvement or purpose described in Section 3 hereof to be incurred and paid prior to the issuance of bonds or notes authorized herein in accordance with Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2(e), and no action (or inaction) will be an artifice or device in accordance with Treasury Regulation Section 1.148-10 to avoid, in whole or in part, arbitrage yield restrictions or arbitrage rebate requirements.

Section 9. To the extent that any previous ordinance or resolution is inconsistent with or contradictory hereto, said ordinance or resolution is hereby repealed or amended to the extent necessary to make it consistent herewith.

Section 10. The provisions of this ordinance are severable. To the extent any clause, phrase, sentence, paragraph or provision of this ordinance shall be declared invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 11. This Bond Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by said Local Bond Law.

Public Hearing on Ordinance #14-01:

- Fire Chief Gerald Marion 11 William Street:
 - Expressed his appreciation and thanked the Mayor and Council and for beginning the process to secure a new home for the Englewood Fire Department. This building will be a source of pride for both the Fire Department and the City of Englewood.

Mayor and Council comments on Ordinance #14-01:

- Councilman Skurnick spoke about Wayne Hamer's idea to give special consideration to contractors and vendors to spend money in the City of Englewood. Contractors should hire Englewood residents and train them. The City of Englewood should expend the same effort that the Englewood Public School District did with the school construction programs.
- Mayor Huttel spoke about the importance of the economics of the City and about the community being one. The Firemen need a home which is safe and a point of pride for the City. It is important that the Mayor and Council make this happen because the existing Fire House is insufficient for the Fire Department's needs. The new Fire House has been a long time coming and has been a priority for the Mayor since he took office in 2010. He agrees with Councilman Skurnick about companies hiring people from Englewood as long as the City complies with the State Public Contracting Laws. The Mayor is pleased that he will no longer have to take visitors to the Fire House at 10PM during a rain storm to see the rain coming into the building.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 8 BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND AGENCIES, SECTION 8-18 ARTICLE IV ADVISORY COMMITTEES OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ENGLEWOOD

WHEREAS, Chapter 8 Boards, Commissions and Agencies, Section 8-18 Article IV, Subsection B (1) provides for the membership of the Recreation Advisory Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City of Englewood wishes to amend the aforesaid Section.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Englewood, Bergen County, New Jersey, that Chapter 8 Boards, Commissions and Agencies, Section 8-18 Article IV, Subsection B (1) is hereby amended as follows:

B. Recreation Advisory Committee.

[Amended 12-7-1982 by Ord. No. 82-48; 2-4-1992 by Ord. No. 92-04; 6-1-1999 by Ord. No. 99-14]

(1) ~~Eight~~ **Twelve** members consisting of ~~one~~ **two** members from each ward and four members at large, with staggered terms so as to result in the expiration of no more than three terms in any one year, appointed by the City Council.

ORDINANCE #14-04

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 425 TREES OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ENGLEWOOD

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City of Englewood wishes to amend Chapter 425 Trees; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Englewood, Bergen County, New Jersey, that Chapter 425 Trees, Article II is hereby amended as follows:

Section 425-7, Definitions:

EMERGENCY REMOVAL A removal which is necessitated by any event, whether natural or man-made, which requires the immediate removal of a regulated tree because it has been determined that such tree presents an imminent hazard to the public's safety. Such determination shall be made by a certified arborist or City official as authorized by the City Manager. **Emergency Removals shall be authorized by the City Engineer prior to a permit however, a permit and replacement plan shall be required within seven (7) days of removal. If a permit application is not received within seven days of removal, the City may take the enforcement steps in this ordinance.**

SECTION 425-11, TREE REPLACEMENT PLAN, SUBSECTION B (3):

Replacement trees, including the size and number of trees, shall be planted in accordance with the following table:

Size of Tree Removed (inches DPM)	Number of Replacement Trees With a DPM of at Least 2 ½ 3 ½ Inches
8 but less than 12 inches	1

Size of Tree Removed (inches DPM)	Number of Replacement Trees With a DPM of at Least 2 1/2 3 1/2 Inches
More than 12 but less than 18 inches	2
More than 18 but less than 24 inches	3
More than 24 but less than 36 inches	4
More than 36	To be determined in consultation with the City Engineer after consideration of the project, but in any event, not less than 6

SECTION 425-12, CONTRIBUTION TO TREE FUND IN LIEU OF PLANTING:

In certain circumstances, the City Engineer may authorize a contribution to the City's Environmental Commission Tree Fund in lieu of planting replacement trees on site where he determines that the purposes of this article would be furthered thereby. Such contribution shall bear a reasonable relationship to the cost of planting trees which would otherwise be required under § 425-11 of this article, but in no case shall it be less than ~~\$200~~ **\$250** per required replacement.

SECTION 425-13, EXEMPTIONS, SUBSECTION H:

H. Emergency removals (*a permit is required within seven (7) days after the removals*).

SECTION 425-15, EXEMPTIONS, SUBSECTIONS A-C:

An application for a tree removal permit shall be accompanied by the required fee as set forth below:

A. Permit for each tree removal: as provided for in Chapter 191, Fee Schedule.

B. Projects involving 1/2 acre of land or less and for each additional 1/2 acre or part thereof above one acre: as provided for in Chapter 191, Fee Schedule.

C. An escrow shall be established in the amount of ~~two times the permit fee~~ **\$250 per tree** which shall be retained until the tree replacement plan is completed. Engineering review fees in connection with the implementation of a tree replacement plan shall be paid from the escrow at the rate established for engineering review fees in connection with site plan approval. In addition, in the event the tree replacement plan is not completed within the time specified by the City Engineer, the City may use such escrow to complete the tree replacement plan or, in lieu thereof, deposit said escrow in the Tree Replacement Fund. Upon completion of the tree replacement plan, the balance remaining in said escrow after payment of the foregoing fees, if any, shall be returned to the applicant.

SECTION 425-17, APPEAL PROCESS:

Appeal of a decision by the City Engineer:

In the event that an applicant does not agree with either the rejection of an application or the conditions imposed by the City Engineer, the applicant may present an appeal to the City Manager, who at his discretion may request assistance from a Representative of the Englewood Environmental Commission and the City Manager will render a decision within 30 days of the submittal.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 358 SOIL EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL; SOIL REMOVAL, ARTICLE II, SECTION 358-14 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ENGLEWOOD

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City of Englewood wishes to amend Chapter 358 Soil Erosion and Sediment Control; Soil Removal, Article II, Section 358-14; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Englewood, Bergen County, New Jersey, that Chapter 358 Soil Erosion and Sediment Control; Soil Removal, Article II, Section 358-14 is hereby amended as follows:

Section 358-14, Soil Removal and Deposit:

Except as otherwise required herein, no person shall disturb any soil upon or transfer soil from or to any property within the City of Englewood without first obtaining a permit therefor from the City Engineer. ***Any change in ground elevation that results in a 2 ft. elevation gain or more within 30 ft. of any side or rear yard property line requires a variance from the Englewood Board of Adjustment. The variance shall be granted only upon the applicant's proof that the impact on adjoining property owners shall be minimal either because:***

1. ***Site lines are obscured because of vegetative screening or***
2. ***Site lines resulting from the grade change present minimal intrusion to the neighbors because of the configuration and/or layout of the respective property."***

Mayor and Council comments on Resolution #050-01-28-14:

- Councilman Cohen read a statement regarding his support for this resolution and to continue the trend to provide the residents of Englewood with a high level of service without raising taxes. He stated that he has introduced this resolution every year since he got on the Council and he considers this to be a Mission Statement.
- Councilman Skurnick will be voting "No" on this resolution for the third year in a row. He spoke about the end of the year tax sale, increases in recreation fees, decreases in the recreation budget and that he had to fight to get them additional funding. Does not want Recreation and Library budgets to be cut.
- Councilman Forman said that since he and Councilman Skurnick have gotten into office the recreation fees have gone down not up.
- Mayor Huttler clarified that the prior City Manager raised recreation fees to the surprise of the Mayor and Council; this was especially surprising to the late Councilman Jack Drakeford. Since that time positive things have happened. The City Manager had proposed a cut in Library funding in 2012 but it did not take effect and the Library instead received additional funding. Mayor Huttler will be working full time with the Library Board to continue to insure proper funding and efficiency of the operation. He does not necessarily support Councilman Cohen's Mission Statement but does want to provide the City's residents with more rather than less.
- Councilman Cohen explained the State requirements for Library funding and that the City of Englewood regularly provides the Library with funding above the State minimums. Recreation fees had not been increased in twenty years and had to be adjusted. A survey was conducted of surrounding towns and Englewood is currently still lower. Funding is provided so that all children can participate and no one is denied. Moving the Tax Sale saved the City \$3 million dollars which prevented a tax increase for all. Approximately 99% of the City's taxpayers pay on time and only 1% is late. The majority should not be punished by having to subsidize those who do not pay on time. His goal is to insure the affordability of the town for its residents. Councilman Skurnick needs to check the Budget for the facts.

Most notable, however, was being selected as one of the "20 To Watch" under forty by the African American Pulpit Journal, (Summer 2005), the Premiere African American Preaching Journal; and

- () Sub-section 2 covering a matter in which release of information would impair a right to receive federal funds.
- () Sub-section 3 involving disclosure of material which would constitute an unwarranted invasion of privacy, including material related to an individual's personal and family circumstances, without the express written consent of the individual involved.
- () Sub-section 4 pertaining to collective bargaining agreements and the terms, conditions, and negotiations thereof.

() Sub-section 5 dealing with the acquisition of real property, the settling of bank rates, or the investment of public funds where discussion thereof would adversely affect the public interest.

() Sub-section 6 dealing with tactics and techniques used in protecting the safety and property of the public where disclosure could impair such protection or investigation of violation of the law.

(X) Sub-section 7 dealing with pending or anticipated litigation, contract negotiations, or matters falling within the attorney-client privilege.

() Sub-section 8 dealing concerning personnel matters dealing with employment, appointment, termination, or terms and conditions of employment of any person or persons, or the evaluation, promotion or disciplining of employees unless all employees involved consent to disclosure thereof.

() Sub-section 9 involving deliberations after public hearing on a matter which may result in the imposition of a civil penalty or the suspension or loss of a license.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, as precisely as can be determined at this time, the discussion conducted in the said closed session can be disclosed to the public upon taking final action thereon, provided disclosure shall not violate the attorney-client privilege or constitute an undue invasion of privacy; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, although it is not envisioned that the Council will return to open session after this meeting, the Council reserves the right to do so upon conclusion of the closed session.
