A Pet Manual, containing all applicable City ordinances, is available upon request. Per ordinance, licensing is limited to six (6) dogs and/or cats per household, with exception made for those exceeding the limit prior to the ordinance only. Free rabies vaccination clinics are sponsored by the Department of Health annually. Renewal reminders are automatically sent at the beginning of each calendar year. It is your responsibility to review your pet's vaccination status and renew prior to March 1st of each year in order to avoid a late fee and any possible summonses. Exemption from vaccination requires veterinarian certification annually (form available on the City's web page).
