## The Third Street Community Garden - Rules & Regulations

Gardeners are required to review and acknowledge that they understand the Rules and Regulations of the Third Street Community Garden.

1. One plot per gardener per year.
2. Gardeners will need to apply anew each year and plots will be awarded on a first come first serve basis.
3. One plot will be offered to the City of Englewood as a teaching bed.
4. Your plot must be cleaned and soil fully prepared by May 15<sup>th</sup>. By June 15<sup>th</sup>, plots should be fully planted. Any unplanted plot failing to meet these conditions is considered abandoned and could be reassigned as noted below. Remove all plants and temporary structures by the October 31<sup>st</sup> fall cleanup deadline.
5. The Garden is open from sunrise to sunset.
6. **Third Street Community Garden is an organic garden.** Use of chemical fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, or rodenticides is strictly prohibited. Use of organic compost and mulch is always acceptable.
7. Garden plots are to be maintained throughout the season with active planting, harvesting, and weeding. Gardeners are encouraged to plant vegetables as well as perennials that attract pollinators and butterflies.
8. All vines must be kept shorter than 6 feet to prevent shade in neighboring plots.
9. Simple, non-permanent structures, such as trellises, are permitted. All structures must be removed by October 31<sup>st</sup>.
10. Mulches such as stone, carpet and artificial turf are not permitted.
11. Place all trash and garden waste in the specially marked bins provided. DO NOT dump plants or trash anywhere outside your plot, or in surrounding park or wooded areas. It is illegal to dump on any public property.
12. Ensure the gate is closed after entering and when leaving the garden.
13. Children must be accompanied by an adult
14. Dogs are not permitted in the Third Street Community Garden

### Gardeners who are not in compliance with these rules will:

- a) Receive a notice by mail, email and/or phone from a member of the Englewood Environmental Commission;
- b) Have 7 calendar days to correct the problem upon receipt of the notice; and,
- c) If the problem(s) is/are not corrected or addressed within the allotted time frame, the garden plot can be reassigned at the discretion of the Englewood Environmental Commission
